Committees

The PCC operates through a number of committees, which meet between the full meetings of the PCC. A Standing Committee exists that is required by law to transact business when necessary between PCC meetings, subject to any directions given by the PCC. The PCC have appointed the Trustees of Old Church of England School to act as managing agents for the OCS building; excluding the letting of the OCS flat and car park spaces. This enables the PCC to obtain all advantages of OCS being a Registered Charity.

Rector's Review for January 2018.

I pray during the year 2018 we may keep our focus on the message of Romans 12:3-8

The year 2017 so far been the most exciting year for me in Hayes. The reason is due to three individuals: Becky, Charlotte and Sofi my daughter.

- 1- No doubt it is Becky who did attend all the theological classes and worked very hard but I think it is OK to say that beside her family I too played a little role in bringing her to where Becky is today. Her training has almost reached completion and she is now licensed LLM. There is this sense of, 'job done, done well' She is serving the Lord with joyful heart and at the start of the year 2018 I had the official confirmation that Becky is now licensed to take funerals too.
- 2- In January 2016 it was just a dream to have a 'Youth and Family Worker' but since mid 017 we had Charlotte among us. The Lord has done it and at least in my eyes it is marvellous. Charlotte is well settled among us and she is impacting ministry in Hayes and beyond.
- 3- In December Rev'd Lyn and Becky our LLM made it possible for me to go to Finland to attend my daughter Sofi's Phd defence. I am sorry if I sound a bit emotional but the truth is when nearly 20 years ago we had our family breakdown; I was left with Sofi and Matti without any immediate family around to support us. In those hostile times even the idea of bringing them up well seemed a huge dream. But in December 2017 I stood among the Academics from around the world as a proud dad of Dr. Sofia John. I am very proud of Sofi's academic achievements, however, in all honesty greater pride for me was her bold stand for her Christian faith in a world where faith has little relevance. The opening words of her published thesis read: "Above all, I want to acknowledge and thank the One who gives life and who has sustained and provided for me throughout this thesis and life journey. The journey has not always been easy, but God's grace has carried me through to the end...". Her, after defence speech started with the Lord Jesus Christ too.

From personal to church: Now form personal joy I turn to the church matters. I thank God that with the support of the Worship Leaders, Ministry Team, Church Warden Mrs Barbara Marsden and her team and indeed the support of so many of you we Ministered and Ministered well to Hayes Community. It is a well known fact that we; who ministered in Hayes Primary School we are at times stopped by children on the road and are told 'most enjoyable assemblies are those you do'. Beside, I regularly receive letters, cards and emails of thanks for the ministry we provide to the wider community. May the Lord give us all the courage and the strength to continue to serve the people God has given to us.

In spite of such encouraging news I don't have any hesitation in saying, 'To be a church in today's UK is not an easy assignment'. In my early years of ministry over 70% of the population identified themselves as Christians. Today people with no religion out number all the Christian denominations put together. Faithlessness like a desert is swallowing communities up. But you my friends are the faithful and brave who stand in the way of this desert. You slow its speed, you feed and you water the existing patches of faith and even sow new seeds to push this desert of faithlessness back. I thank God for each one of you for the role you played. I am deliberately leaving the names out as it is not just us the Worship Leaders and the PCC who are doing it. We are all participants no one here is looked as an audience.

From the general now I turn to some specifics of the year 2017:

Prayer walks: At the last APCM I suggested to start prayer walks in the summer months of 2017. Today I can report that we did walk the whole Benefice and prayed for our community. Now the we continue to go street by street to pray and bless our community. I hope this does play a small role for the church to be seen in the community.

Reviewing our Sunday services: The year 2017 was the year to review our church services. I am pleased to inform that all the changes that we planned are in place and the new patterns of worship are shaping our spirituality here. I am aware these changes were a challenge for some but you have been very gracious in accepting our vision. I think it is also fair to say that these changes are not written in stones

and the Worship Leaders will continue to review and see how ministry is improved and church is made even more relevant for the people we minister.

Day time bible studies for parents and grand parents: Becky and myself had a vision to start a morning bible study group during the last APCM year. The reason to start such a group was to provide an opportunity for those who find difficult to attend bible study/prayer group in the evening. I am pleased to inform that we finished our first such bible study group in February 2018. We hope to continue the group after the Easter and if there is demand even to multiply morning bible study groups. .

Raising new champions: This was the fourth aim for the last APCM. Since my arrival in January 2013 I have raised the alarm that there is need to raise new leaders in this church. At the last APCM I made it known to you again. I suggested, 'let us raise new champions', for new people who take responsibilities and those who have ministered in different aread may become 'mentors'. I am afraid in this area we haven't been very successful. I hope this year we will work together to be more effective so by the next APCM we will have even more new faces.

The dream for 2018. I regard this APCM year the year of my colleagues' vision/s. During the last five years I have given vision/s for the year. This is the year of my colleagues.

The over all desire of your worship leaders is that we are seen as one church, united under one Lord, using our gifts to minister to the people the Lord has given to us.

Lyn: After Easter hope to start a new short course. 'Making Space For God: Trying out different ways of meditation and praying.

Becky: will focus to develop her Pastoral Ministry along with Lyn and Napo. Secondly, she hopes to start a new group; namely 'outreach group'.

Charlotte: Please see her report these are covered there.

Napo's hope: Finally I hope that we will keep our focus on the passage I mentioned earlier. May God give us grace so we continue to grow in our mutual respect and support for one another. I pray that we may always remember that we may wear different job titles but no one is doing less important job in God's kingdom. Each role is as important and valid as is any other member of Christ's body here. Let us learn to love and respect each others gifting in Christ's humility!

Honorary Treasurer's Report for the year ended 31st December 2017

2017 saw a further reduction in the Church's income, which was only partially offset by income from the OCS Flat and the OCS Grant. This, together with a modest increase in expenditure, led to an overall deficit. The following table seeks to highlight the main numbers:

Income: Total income saw a reduction of just over £4,000 which was mainly down to a further fall in Pledged Giving from £47,764 to £45,933 - accompanied by a consequential fall in Gift Aid recovery. Fees remained fairly flat whilst there was a one-off fall in Collections due to last year including some back-dated Gift Aid. With Pledged Giving the reliance on a few "large givers" remains: as such it remains critically important for more parishioners, especially more recent newcomers, to join the scheme.

Expenditure: Total expenditure increased by just under £2,000 (circa 2.0%): there were some "ups and downs" but with no one item being the main cause. Levels of expenditure remain at acceptable levels but the general focus on costs will continue.

<u>Deficit on Ordinary Items</u>: As shown in the above table the Church continues to run at a deficit, with the above variances leading to a sharp increase in this deficit to £20,158. Whilst (as mentioned below) there are a number of factors which see this deficit reducing to a more modest overall deficit, it is hugely important that income levels are not allowed to fall further.

Overall Result: As can be seen from both the above table and the formal accounts the overall result for the year sees a manageable deficit of £2,439 - with, as usual, the importance of income from the OCS complex being a major factor. This deficit has led to the General Reserve reducing to £61,958 - a level which still leaves us reasonably well placed and importantly in excess of the minimum level of £50,000 set by the PCC.

<u>Legacies</u>: The Church was extremely fortunate to receive two significant legacies in 2016 which meant that total legacies at the beginning of 2017 amounted to £331,973. Aside from some other modest uses, the PCC have now approved the transfer to other designated funds the sums of £67,000 in respect of the Youth and Families Worker and £62,000 for essential repairs to the OCS Flat. However, and taking into account some further legacy receipts, this still leaves a total legacy balance of £235,092 at the 2017 year-end.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the year ended 31st December 2017

CHARITY REGISTRATION

In accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act the PCC was registered as a separate charity with effect from 28th January 2010 (registration number: 1133878). The charity name is "The Parochial Church Council of the Ecclesiastical Parish of St Mary's, Hayes, Kent": however the working name remains "Hayes (Kent) Parochial Church Council". The trustees are both the ex-officio and the elected members of the PCC.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006, the current Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting (FRS102 - applied from 1st January 2016) and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for the valuation of investment assets, which are shown at market value.

The accounts include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which the trustees are responsible in law. They do not include the accounts of church groups that owe their main affiliation to another body, nor those that are informal gatherings of Church members.

Funds

The General Reserve represents the funds of the PCC that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available for the general purposes of the PCC. The current policy of the PCC is for the General Reserve to be at a minimum level of £50,000, which is approximately six months' ordinary expenditure. On this basis the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing these financial statements.

Designated Funds and Reserves represent monies that have been set aside by the PCC for specific needs or projects but which remain under the control of the PCC. As such they may be subject in the future to either re-designation or transfer back to the General Reserve.

Restricted Funds and Reserves represent monies that have been either donated or received in connection with a specific use, need or project and thus they may only be used in this connection. As such they are not normally available for the general use of the PCC.

Incoming Resources

Planning giving, collections and similar donations are recognised when received. Tax refunds (usually through Gift Aid) are accrued for in the same accounting period as the incoming resource to which they relate is received. Grants and legacies are accounted for as soon as the PCC is notified of legal entitlement, the amount due is quantifiable and its ultimate receipt by the PCC is reasonably certain. Dividends are accounted for when payable, interest as and when accrued by the payer. All incoming resources are accounted for on a gross basis.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (continued) for the year ended 31st December 2017

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Resources Used

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over, or when awarded if that award creates a binding obligation on the PCC. The diocesan "offer payment" is accounted for when payable, with any amount unpaid at 31st December provided for in the accounts as an operational (though not a legal) liability and thus shown as a creditor in the Balance Sheet.

All other expenditure is generally recognised when it is occurred and is accounted for gross. In addition accruals are raised at the end of each accounting period for expenditure which has been incurred in that period but which has not been paid out by the period end.

Fixed Assets

Consecrated property and movable church furnishings

Consecrated and beneficed property is excluded from the accounts in accordance with the Charities Act 2011. Movable church furnishings held by the Rector and Churchwardens on special trust for the PCC, and which require a faculty for disposal, are accounted as inalienable property unless consecrated. All expenditure incurred during the year on consecrated or benefice buildings and movable church furnishings, whether maintenance or improvement, is separately disclosed and usually written-off as expenditure in the accounts.

Other fixtures, fittings and office equipment

Equipment used within the church premises is usually written-off when the asset is acquired. Any exceptions to this policy are fully disclosed, together with a note regarding depreciation policy.

Gains and losses on investments

Realised gains or losses are recognised when investments are sold. Unrealised gains or losses are accounted for on the revaluation of investments at 31st December.

Current Assets

Debtors

Amounts owing to the PCC at 31st December in respect of fees, rents or other income are shown as debtors less any provision for amounts that may prove uncollectable.

Short-term deposits

Short-term deposits include cash held on deposit with either Barclays Bank, the Diocese of Rochester or in the CBF Church of England Deposit Fund.

During 2009 the value of the old Hand Bells was written-off, whilst a new set was purchased for £7,324: a first year depreciation charge of £1,024 was taken, whilst the balance is to be depreciated over a further nine years. The OCS value is as estimated by the PCC's Finance Committee.

6. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The total amounted received (excluding any associated Gift Aid) during the year, either by way of Planned Giving or donations, from any person (or their spouse/partner) who was a Trustee at any point in 2017 amounted to £7,732 in respect of Unrestricted Funds and £440 in respect of Restricted Funds.

The total amount paid by way of expenses, as opposed to reimbursement in the normal course for materials and/or services purchased on behalf of the PCC, to Trustees during the year amounted to £502 (previous year £625).

Accountancy services totalling £800 (previous year - £550) were paid to Olivia Truelove-Dodd, who is related to the Honorary Treasurer.

Basis of this report

The examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the PCC and a comparison of the accounts with those records. It also includes considering any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
